After several months of ongoing postponements, restrictions and limitations impacting our options for granting dreams, our team of passionate and dedicated volunteers are eager to administer the dreams that have been delayed due to the pandemic.

While we've been forced to postpone a number of dreams due to travel and contact restrictions, thankfully community support has continued. As a result, we are well positioned with the resources to begin granting the 50 dreams currently in our pipeline. These resources include volunteers, community partners, sponsors and donors who dedicate time, funding, creativity and

connections which generates unique experiences to bring lifetime memories, hope and smiles to our children battling chronic & critical illnesses.

I want to express a special appreciation to one of our long-time supporters, the pinstriping artists. This team of artists have a passion for making dreams come true and positively impacting the lives of children fighting critical illnesses. I encourage you to read their story below which outlines the history of their ongoing support throughout the past 19 years.

I also want to specially thank a team of dedicated volunteers who have organized the annual Boulevard of Dreams event. This group exemplifies a heart and passion for making dreams come true and as they host this year's 11th Annual event, Dreamin' at the Drive-In, we realize the significant source of funding this has become for The Dream Factory of Greater Kansas City.

Boulevard of Dreams originated 12 years ago when a group of young professionals in the design industry came together with a goal of raising proceeds for a local non-profit that supported children in need. They connected with The Dream Factory of Greater Kansas City and decided to plan a benefit fundraiser that would raise awareness and funding to assist in granting dreams for children battling serious illnesses. After 10 years of hosting this event, it has grown from 200 attendees raising \$12,000 for our organization to 400 guests generating \$130,000 to benefit The Dream Factory of Greater Kansas City. Collectively, this event has raised nearly \$750,000!

I am in awe of the ongoing support offered by the Kansas City Community which provides the necessary resources to allow our organization to continue making dreams a reality. It is the ongoing encouragement, love and overall support expressed by our partners, volunteers, donors, sponsors, friends and families that inspire The Dream Factory of Greater Kansas City to embrace endurance and overcome challenges to bring children sunshine during their times of darkness.

Nick Mershon



Nick Mershon was diagnosed with Generalized Dystonia 3 years ago. This type of dystonia affects his whole body, but his feet, legs, hands, neck, shoulders, face, and mouth are most involved. Nick's symptoms vary greatly day-to-day but

are managed through medications, Deep Brain Stimulation programming, massage therapy and medication.

Nick has always been a horror fan and one of his dreams was to attend Halloween Horror Nights at Universal Studios in Florida. The Dream Factory of Greater Kansas City made his dream a reality! Nick's family would like to express a special thanks to Nick's Dream Manager Ralph Turec, and all the volunteers and donors who helped make Nick's dream come true.

On October 10, 2020, Ralph Turec and Laura Foster, a representative of Country Financial who directly funded Nick's dream, surprised Nick with his trip and then celebrated with monster donuts. A few weeks later, Nick, along with his 2 moms and his older brother, traveled to Orlando to visit Halloween Horror Nights along with several other rides and attractions at Universal Studios.

While in Florida, they took time to visit Star Wars Galaxy's Edge at Disney and spent a day at Cocoa Beach. Nick's favorite highlights of the trip included loading up on lots of horror merchandise and drinking unlimited milkshakes! He still loves telling his classmates and teachers about his trip, especially how his moms and brother got scared in the haunted houses!

As Nick's condition progresses, it is becoming harder for him to have the strength and stamina to leave the house for long periods of time. Nick's family is so thankful for The Dream Factory of Greater Kansas City, Ralph and Country Financial for working to grant Nick's dream trip during a time he was able to maximize his enjoyment of the experience, even in lieu of COVID-19 complicating travel.





Supporter Spotlight

Our Supporter Spotlight and Dreamcatcher of the month is the Pinstripers

Since 2003, a group of artists have gathered every year to demonstrate their skills as pinstripers at the World of Wheels Car Show in Kansas City, MO. Pinstriping is the art of hand-painted graphics, lettering, stripes, cartoons, etc., that is done primarily on vehicles, such as Hot Rods. Each year, the pinstripers create a collection of their artwork and set up a booth displaying their talents, painting various panels and other items during the show. The pinstripers provide their artwork to the many auctions held during the show with 100% of the money

raised going to The Dream Factory of Greater Kansas City. The 2021 show was held March 26-28th and raised over \$10,000, bringing the 19 year total to well over \$200,000 for our organization.

When these artists were asked what the Dream Factory means to them, they responded: "We held the Dream Factory close to our hearts as we were deciding which charity we would adopt to be the beneficiary of the auction; we wanted an organization that truly helped bring joy to those they serve. Another deciding factor is that the Dream Factory is made up of 100% volunteers. We wanted to make sure our efforts were going to a worthy cause, rather than to pay employees and only have a small percentage of our donations actually going to help the children.

Every year, we get excited throughout the auctions as we watch the dollars add up and we can't wait to hear the final total realizing our hard work has paid off. A very special moment was a couple years ago when a past dream recipient who had received him dream 15 years prior visited the pinstripers booth. He and his father are hot rod enthusiasts and shared with us the story about his dream and what it will always mean to him and his family. This really brought everything into perspective for us sparking our desire to work even harder to help fulfill more dreams for more children".

Q. What is the highlight of your time as a volunteer?


